### Interim Iterations

A few years back, then Editor/Publisher John M. Buchanan, writing in *The Christian Century*, quoted a few sentences from Frederick Buechner's essay titled, "The Church." You can find this essay in Buechner's book, *Secrets in the Dark*. I believe these words can give some direction to the members and friends of Speedway as you move through your time of transition.

Here are Buechner's words:

"Maybe the best thing that could happen to the church would be for some great tidal wave of history to wash it all away — the church buildings tumbling, the church money all lost, the church bulletins blowing through the air like dead leaves, the differences between preachers and congregations all lost too. Then all we would have left would be each other and Christ, which was all there was in the first place."

I first read these words back in 2015. It was long before the "great tidal wave of history," Covid-19, would appear. Nevertheless, his words seem appropriate to address where we find ourselves today in the church. I am reminded that our call into existence as the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), our birth certificate if you will, was a last will and testament. Ask me about this if you do not understand what I mean.

As I write, has been reported that over 500,000 Americans have died from Covid in just a little over a year. The bells of death have tolled and continue to toll until we get this dreaded virus behind us. All the while, we need to face the current realities facing the church with openness and candor. No proverbial sweeping of the dirt under the ecclesiastical carpet will suffice any longer.

And what are the current realities facing the church? Many of our congregations are struggling to pay the preacher, keep the lights on, and fix the leaking roof. Births, baby dedications, baptisms, marriages, and developing and growing the membership are not keeping pace with the congregation's rate of attrition due to people leaving, resigning, retiring, moving, and dying.

And here's the rub. In Buchanan's words:

"... many neighborhood and rural congregations require courageous new thinking if they are to survive — new thinking on the part of denominational executives, pastors brave enough to walk into challenging situations, and people willing to let go of a church model that no longer works."

Now the good news is that there are congregations, large and small, that are leaning into their futures in spite of the current realities of demographic decline and its accompanying spiritual and economic distress. We can learn from them. They have recreated church anew for this day and time. They are passionate about who they are and inspire others to accompany them on the journey.

Congregations that are leaning into their future are congregations that are less gate-keeping and permissionseeking, and more mission and action oriented. They have learned to cut through the red tape of congregational bureaucracy and launch

themselves directly into those places of great human need. They define their mission in their specific local context and are tenacious about focusing on it. These congregations do not try to be everything to everybody, but are singularly focused on the welfare and benefit of those they serve.

When all is said and done, it is true that the center and core of congregational life is "each other and Christ, which is all there was in the first place." This is not a bad place to start as Speedway leans into its future during this time of transition. I am glad to be part of the new discoveries you are making. Keep looking through the front windshield and not the rear view mirror. This will surly take you to the place God wants you to be!
