SCC Congregation calls the Reverend Kyle Hunter

It is official! Members of Speedway Christian Church voted by the required two-thirds margin to call Rev. Kyle Hunter as its new Senior Minister.

Kyle was born and grew up in Lebanon, Indiana. He earned a bachelor's degree at IUPUI, majoring in organizational leadership. He then studied at Christian Theological Seminary, where he earned his

MDIV. He was ordained in 2016, and has been senior minister of Bethany Christian Church in Evansville for the past five years. While he was in seminary, he served as minister at Yorktown Christian Church. He is a third-generation member of the Disciples of Christ denomination.

He has been married to his wife, Krista, for 14 years. They have three children: seven-yearold Aubrey, five-year-old Cody, and one-year-old Lucy. Krista is also from Lebanon. They are happy about being called to Speedway Christian Church and that they will be living closer to their families.



Kyle has participated in a variety of class and workshops led by the Disciples of Christ on topics such as antiracism, recognizing and dealing with child abuse, and best practice for navigating worship both online and in person.

He has led church camp sessions with Rev. Rick Harting (who grew up in Speedway Christian Church), and he has also led mission trips.

We thank the search committee for their dedication to finding the right candidate. The committee received applications from all over the country. Search committee members used responses from the congregation survey last fall to determine what our members were looking for in a new senior minister. Search committee members were particularly impressed by Kyle's listening and communications skills, his spiritual depth, his rapport with people of all ages, and his passion for pastoral care. All of those were priorities for our congregation.

Kyle will start August 1. In the meantime, our congregation will be well-cared for by our interim senior minister, Rev. Ron Degges.

Our church staff and board members are already planning for a smooth leadership transition and a warm welcome for the Hunter family. You'll hear much more about Rev. Kyle Hunter between now and August 1, 2021.

I wanted to particularly address my remarks in this month's column to all of you who, like me, are in that category of individuals labeled 'senior citizens'.

Did you know that Michelangelo painted the ceiling in the Sistine Chapel lying on his back on a scaffold when almost 90? Paderewski at 79 played the piano with gusto? At 88 John Wesley preached every day? Tennyson, when83, wrote: 'Crossing the Bar'? Booth Tarkington wrote 16 novels after 60, some of them when he was almost totally blind? Benjamin Franklin went to France in the service of his country when 78, and wrote his autobiography when over 80?

Imagine what God has in store for you as you are either running away from old age, staring old age in the eyes, or in the very midst of its grip. Surely there are some accomplishments waiting to be done. Maybe there is some unfinished business that needs finishing. Whatever your particular case may be, here are three gems to guide you in your senior years:

- The one who dwells in the past grows old before his time.
- The one who lives in the future remains young forever.

We justify our existence not by adding years to our lives, but by adding life to our years.

As Browning has written:

"Grow old along with me! The best is yet to be, The last of life, for which the first was made: Our times are in [God's] hand Who saith, 'A whole I planned, Youth shows but half; Trust God; see all nor be afraid!""

Browning's words have always been some of my favorite. However, my confidence in them was shaken when I learned that he was only 28 years old when he wrote them. Then again, I thought, maybe some 28 year-old have an expansive view of that 'other half'.

Such literary and poetic gems stand on my bookshelf in one of my favorite reference works, <u>Familiar Quotations</u> by John Bartlett. This is an excellent work that I have lifted up to our pastors across the country to add some substance to sermons, Bible studies, and presentations.

As this congregation moves into its future, I encourage you to give some consideration not only to those living in the first half of their lives, but to those living in the second half of their lives. A transforming congregation knows how to reach out to both!
