Renovation debt is paid off

We are overwhelmed with the response to our request in the June issue of Spirit to consider paying off our Speedway Christian Church renovation loan even earlier than we anticipated.

This was one of many times over the years our congregation members and friends have shown their generosity and their faithfulness to our church.

We knew it was possible and you did it in just a few short weeks!

It feels good to be free of this obligation. Just as it feels good to have a building that is more modern, functional, accessible and attractive than it was 20 years ago. We had hoped to retire the debt before Rev. Hunter arrived, and we met that goal well before August 1!

Thank you for making your church a priority, whether you paid in the early years, made your contributions in this final sprint, or faithfully made donations every month, quarter or year throughout the life of the loan.

Of course, our building will continue to need maintenance and improvements. Our missions and programs will continue to need support. Our operational expenses are always with us. We encourage you to consider how your giving might change now that we no longer have renovation debt. Some people may wish to apply the amount they previously set aside for the renovation to new uses so our church and its programs can thrive.

We'll explore various giving opportunities in future issues of Spirit.

Prayground

You have likely noticed we have a new space for children at the front of the sanctuary! Thousands of churches around the world have had a lot of success engaging children in worship through a space commonly called a Prayground. This is a space where kids (of all ages) can be during worship to color, work puzzles, look at books, and do other small, quiet activities while they worship alongside the adults. This is an effort Reverend Ron Degges actually helped support through his leadership at Disciples Home Missions. Most kids will likely decide to leave the Prayground after children's time to go to Worship and Wonder, but they also have the option of staying if that is where they (or their family) are more comfortable. By being at the front of the sanctuary where they can see, with small activities to occupy their hands, churches who have tried it find, not surprisingly, that kids often have rich worship experiences where they are able to learn about God and grow in their faith, just as we adults do during worship. It also helps them to feel more comfortable and welcome in the sanctuary, which we all definitely want to see.

Our Worship and Wonder program is still very active for children ages $4 - 2^{nd}$ grade and those under 4 years old are welcome in our nursery. Of course, children of all ages are welcome to join us in the sanctuary for worship as well.
