

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lent is right around the corner and is often a time of

repentance and reflection. This Lent, we are going to explore together the ways that we might *cultivate* and *Let Go. Cultivate* a verb, means to prepare and use for the raising of crops; to foster the growth of; to improve by labor, care, or study; to refine; to further; to encourage. *Let go*, also a verb, means to relinquish one's grip on someone or something. In the



coming Lenten season, let's do a little bit of spiritual gardening. Let's invite God to unearth in us what lies fallow, what needs to be tended, and what needs to die for new life to emerge. In this coming Lenten season, let's embrace the literal and spiritual practices of cultivating and letting go.

The season of Lent will start this year a bit differently than it has in the past. In the spirit of *Fat Tuesday*, the final day before traditional Lenten fasting takes place, we are working at organizing a pancake dinner that will be held on Wednesday before the Ash Wednesday worship service that will include the imposition of ashes. This worship service has long been observed by Christian communities as a reminder that we are made from dust, and eventually, to dust we will all return. It also marks the beginning of Lent and our new worship series, *Cultivate* and *Let Go*.

Throughout this upcoming season, we will have multiple opportunities to engage in the practice of *cultivating* and *letting go*. A devotional will help us to dig deeper into the texts for the week. We will utilize portions of that devotional during the Monday sessions of Lunch and Learn that starts at Noon. If you ever wanted to engage deeply with the texts and themes each Sunday, this is the conversation for you, see you in the Bethany Room!

Lenten Materials


Lent is a season in deep contemplation and prayer, of

40 Prayers for 40 Days

Eight years ago, at my church in Blacksburg, VA, the associate pastor preached a sermon about prayer, en-



and I continue the tradition today.

Throughout the season of Lent at Speedway I will use these prayers as preludes, offertories, postludes, and pieces for the choir to sing. I don't always have the words I need, but this Lenten tradition has shown me that I always have a way to pray. My hope is that - through the music I play, the songs the choir sings, or the pieces the hand bells ring - we allow ourselves to pray through music.

I invite everyone to join me for a Lenten recital on Sunday March 13 at 3pm. I will share some of my favorite organ and piano pieces on Lenten themes, as well as some of my own improvisations.

An Opportunity to Help

"In Venezuela, we were living in fear. My mother worked for the government in Venezuela, and she quit her job. Our lives were at risk. I remember when I was in junior high, I was walking to school one day and a man on a motorcycle stopped in front of me. He told me that if my mother leaves the government, something would either happen to me or my mom. I stopped going to school because of that incident. Things continued to worsen. We lived in government housing and people would spray paint our exterior apartment walls with words like "traitors". One day we came home to find our things were black and singed. It turned out someone had broken into our apartment and scorched all of our things. It was time to defect."

These words, written by a senior at Speedway High School, is an example of the plight some of our international students have endured to move to the United States. Approximately a half dozen seniors at Speedway High School are graduating this year as asylum seekers. Unfortunately, the state of Indiana is one of three states in the country that requires these students to pay out-of-state tuition because of their "international status". To give you an idea of how detrimental this is, the annual cost of in-state tuition at Indiana University is \$11,220 as compared to its out-of-state tuition cost of \$37.600.

Therefore, we are raising money to provide micro scholarships to international Speedway High School students. The application process is simple: the student will write a short essay on the hardship (s)he has endured to get to the United States and how (s)he has overcome obstacles. Any student who applies will receive a portion of the donated funds. A little money can have a big impact on students who must "earn as they learn".

What is a Deacons and an Elder of a church?

The Elders are a group who provide energetic spiritual and church leadership. Elders also provide guidance and wisdom to the spiritual and functional life of the church. One member of the ministry presides at the Communion Table each week to pray with the minister. Currently the members of this ministry also serve as worship leaders during services. Providing pastoral care to those in need is also a task this ministry completes. An Elder serves for 1-3 years for the church.

The Diaconate (or Deacons) assists with the Worship and Fine Arts ministry as requested. On a regular basis, the teams rotate to help worship services run smoothly. They assist in greeting members and guests, taking offerings, ushering those who need assistance, passing communion, and cleaning up the sanctuary after services. We are currently in need of 2 youth Deacons and more adult Deacons. We would like to make a transition to passing the offering plate and could use more help! A Deacon serves for 1-3 years for the church.

Both of these groups are a great way to share your talents and gifts with the church. Do you like to pray with people and visit those who need God's love? Being an Elder is a perfect fit. Do you prefer out of the spot light and are a more hands on servant of the Lord? Being a Deacon would be a great task. If you are already involved in a Ministry or Committee of the church you can still be an Elder or Deacon.
