- Or through SCC—make your check payable to Speedway Christian Church, note: Crop Walk in memo section.



A Life of Strong Faith and Love Linda and I feel God has presented us with a great opportunity and an interesting challenge. A little over fourteen years ago, Linda's daughter, Erin, 28, and her two sons, Bryson, 5, and Bryden, 2, were killed in a house fire which also took the life of the boys' father. Thru the Grace of God, the only survivor was Erin's daughter, Elysah, who was two weeks old. She was placed in a medically induced coma for four days and when she was brought out of it, I was around to feed her first two bottles.

She survived and she has thrived. She is now 14 and taller than all of us. She is an excellent student and accomplished volleyball player playing varsity as a freshman on her high school team.

Her mother's brother, Jason, adopted Elysah, going from uncle to dad at the stroke of a judge's pen. They live in New Castle, where Jason serves as a Sergeant with the Henry County Sheriff's Department. He is raising her as a single parent and is doing a great job.

Elysah and her grandmother Linda have always been close, thanks in part to social media. But the time is right for them to be closer...geographically. It is an opportunity we want to explore. We will be moving to New Castle in the middle of September.

We well miss Rev. Kyle and Rev. Katie, Travis' amazing music and choirs, coffee and donuts for Sunday breakfasts. We will especially miss the friends we have made here at Speedway Christian Church. The love and support extended to us this past year following my fall at Decatur Central was gratefully appreciated. When in New Castle, come see us. And we will be back!
