This is the second day of our Fall Break work trip addressing the absolute devastation that occurred here and in Dawson Spirings from a series of tornadoes. As I write this, I am tired, but it is the good type of tired. The tired that only comes from being the hands and feet of Christ in these communities. Yesterday, we had the opportunity to speak with a homeowner who shared

with us how thankful she is that we are here, doing this work. As she fought back tears, she told us that you all, and other groups like you, are doing the work that we could not. And that makes the sore muscles not seem near as bad. And these young people, let me tell you, are amazing! They have worked as hard as any young group that I have been a part of and that is saying a lot. I think this makes my fifteenth work trip over the years, and this one has been amazing. Among the best I've experienced.

Tomorrow, we will work a half day, load up and make our way back to Speedway. My prayer for these youth all week has been that they will take something from this experience back with them. I pray that they will know and appreciate the impact that giving up a portion of their Fall Break has had on the communities that we have worked in. I pray that they will come to know that they can continue to have an impact on and in their own neighbors. I hope they know that it doesn't take a disaster for them to respond to. But, by being who they are created to be, it is enough. That authenticity can be, and is, transformative.

This work is holy, friends. I am so very thankful for the opportunity to be here. I am thankful to hold these wonderful people in prayer. I am thankful that you have held us all in prayer, too. I am thankful that my muscles and bones hurt, but my heart and sprit are so very full.

I leave you with the words of Saint Teresa of Avila from the wonderful devotional that Rev. Katie put together for our trip

2022 Mission Trip

Mission Trip Recap

It was during a casual conversation with Rich Hoerger in early August that he expressed a desire to help those in eastern Kentucky who were experiencing some disastrous flooding that this trip came to be. After that conversation, I called Week of Compassion who said that it would be difficult to invite a group to the region as they were still in the immediate stages after the flooding. They did say, however, that western Kentucky could still use a lot of help after the 30+tornadoes that swept through the region in December 2021. After some additional conversations with Week of Compassion and their partner, Crossroads International, our trip came to be.

It was in these planning stages that I was reminded of the incredible work of Week of Compassion. The national media and our societal attention spans have long since moved on from these tornadoes, and yet Week of Compassion remains until the work is complete and lives are rebuilt. And we know that work is only done by of those who say "yes" to a felt call to help both in their monetary generosity and in their generosity of time and work.

Gratefully, last week 27 of our people answered that call for a four day whirlwind trip to Princeton, Kentucky. We stayed at First Christian Church, a small congregation that completely transformed the life of their ministry after the tornadoes and became a place to house volunteers. What an incredible ministry of hospitality.

I was struck by many things while on this trip. I was reminded that it's one thing to know that something terrible has happened, that 30+ tornadoes violently swept through Western Kentucky, and something else entirely to feel it, to pick up rumble that used to hold so much of someone's life and find within it a Barbie doll, drywall that used to hold pictures of someone's loved ones, a remote control, to be standing on steps that used to lead to someone's porch and now lead...nowhere. On the other hand, what a holy moment to be able to look into the eyes of someone whose life will be immediately impacted because of the work you did.

It was a moving experience to watch the youth move through their days, processing what they were seeing and feeling throughout, and then at the day's end, having deep discussions about where we experienced joy and where we saw God in the rubble.

Dedication looks like Easter egg hunts, dress up nativity skits, vacation bible school silliness, budget meetings, building repairs, managing egos and expectations, gathering around a table or a campfire, showing up and cheering from the sidelines of sporting events and performances, making crabby teenagers laugh, finding ways to connect with and inspire wise, seasoned members who have seen and experienced things you never have, high-fiving preschoolers, and sometimes **dedication** even looks like mopping up overflowed toilets.

I am humbled and grateful for the **dedication** that Kyle and Katie have shown our church family - the dedication they show day in and day out.


