Thinking out Loud...

I have started a sermon series which I am calling the *This I Believe* series. I got the idea from two sources. One is a lecture I heard on You tube by the author Anne Lamott. In the lecture she speaks of the twelve things that she believes are absolutely true by which she tries to live. In the lecture, she has her characteristic poignancy and humor.

The other source of my "inspiration" for the series comes from a book titled *This I Believe*. Eighty essayists, from the well-known to the unknown, complete the words "This I Believe blank," and they fill in the blank with a short essay in which they describe one thing by which they try to live.

In the sermon series, I am going to preach about one thing each week for ten weeks that are true for me. I have already preached two sermons in the series. The first is: "This I Believe: We Have Little to No Control in Life." The second is: "This I Believe: Love Is the Most Powerful Force in the Universe." I try to live my life by these. Your list may or may not correspond with some or any on my list. I'm not going to try to convert you to my list; although, I obviously hope that you will take them into consideration, since they are so important to me. But what I especially hope that you will do is begin to think about the things with which you would fill the blank in the statement: "This I Believe blank."

A couple in our church think that it would be interesting to have all of us write a sentence or two with which we would fill the blank. These should be statements that are at the heart of your life. I encourage you write a statement, and then drop it in the offering plate. You can remain anonymous or sign your name to the statement; although, I prefer that you sign your name, so we will get to know you better. But you aren't obligated to sign your statement. At the couple's suggestion, we will have some of these published in upcoming newsletters. (If you are homebound and would like to participate in this, please call the church office and share your statement.)

Why don't you ponder one thing that is at the heart of what is an essential belief for you? Won't it be interesting to see what others believe? Undoubtedly, our statements will reveal the diversity of beliefs in our congregation. It will remind us of how in Jesus we remain united.
