### Thinking Out Loud...

As many of you know, our church, along with me, applied for a Lilly Grant that would fund a three month sabbatical, beginning in mid-April 2018. I am very happy to announce that the grant has been awarded.

A big thanks to the Sabbatical Committee who crafted the grant proposal with me. The members of the committee are Bill Harting (the younger), Sandy Hostrawser, Don Pirtle, Jared Trullinger, Art Vermillion, and Dorothy Webb. A special thanks to the Board for unanimously approving applying for the grant. Thanks to the Personnel Committee for their support of the sabbatical from the time I first approached them about the possibility. Thanks to those who gave feedback to the members of the Sabbatical Committee during the preliminary stages of writing the grant proposal. And thanks to all of you who on numerous occasions asked if I had received word about the grant application. Your enthusiasm has been encouraging. I am grateful to be serving a congregation that sees the value of the ongoing renewal of their ministers.

Lilly has done research that indicates that sabbaticals strengthen congregations and ministers as ministers have the opportunity to step away from the day-to-day work of congregational ministry and be renewed by engaging in activities and spiritual practices. Sabbaticals are for congregations and ministers who are enjoying their ministry together and want to have even more energy and creativity. A sabbatical is seen as preventive medicine by helping alleviate burnout, which is common among ministers. Besides having a minister who returns to the church renewed and refueled, the congregation benefits from the minister's time away as the congregation engages in activities that parallel what the minister is doing while she or he is away.

I love my work at Speedway Christian, and I look forward to serving with you in our ministry in the years ahead. I believe that our experiences during the sabbatical will help prepare for our ministry over the long-haul.

In the months ahead, you will be hearing more about the activities in which you will engage while I am away. And you will hear how my responsibilities will be covered. In the meantime, let's continue to do good ministry together as we share the good news of God's love for all people.

I've been struggling for two years now as I have watched my sister, her husband, and now my brother quietly slip out of my physical life. I was in the hospital myself when my sister died--unable to go to her memorial service. I was able to attend my brother-in-law's memorial service. He died the day after Christmas, 2016. My brother had been fighting prostate cancer for years but had kept it in check for a long time but as you know, cancer's wicked head always reappears when you least expect it.

David fought the fight bravely and Art and I tried to be with him as much as we could----David kept reminding me that I was the last sibling and I needed to take care of myself----we talked about a lot of things that we used to do as kids---we always played together because there was only two years difference between our ages and not many kids around. I always took care of him---one day it was particularly windy and since he was always "scrawny" I held on to him for dear life. Of course it made him angry, but I didn't want him blowing away.

If God were not a part of my life nor a part of David's we could not have had the hope of tomorrow in our hearts that we have. We often had prayer at David's bedside before we left leaving his care where it needed to be, in God's hands. I feel so empty right now even though I know God is there in the midst of my loneliness----I have a most loving and supportive husband and family around me holding me up in this time and a God that is supporting all of us.
