Thinking Out Loud...

We have watched with sadness the destruction that has occurred in Houston and surrounding areas. For most of us, it is impossible to imagine such devastation. It may lead us to question where God is in all of this. In order to explain this, there is some sick theology that says that Hurricane Harvey is God's judgement of sin, so the hurricane serves as a wake up call to "get right with God." I call this *sick* theology because for the Christian, the God Jesus revealed would never do such a thing.

There isn't a complete answer to where is God in all of this. There is, however, a partial answer. God is at work through police officers, firefighters, and other rescue personnel. God is at work through government officials who are doing all they can to dispatch help. God is at work through faith communities and other citizens who are reaching out to those who have been hit the hardest. And yes, God can work through us through our financial gifts.

There are a variety of non-profit groups who do good work to which we can contribute. I suggest that we consider a gift to Week of Compassion. Many of you know that I am passionate about the work of Week of Compassion. *Week* of Compassion is emphasized by many Disciples congregations for a week in February, but I remind you that *Week* of Compassion is at work throughout the year doing wonderful ministry. One of its primary ministries is to reach out to those throughout the world who have been impacted by natural disasters. Week of Compassion is already responding in Houston and nearby places that have been hit so hard.

Please consider letting God work through you by making a check out to the church. Please write "Week of Compassion: Hurricane Harvey Relief" in the memo section. As an announcement in this newsletter indicates, 100% of the contribution will go to hurricane relief. There is *no* administrative cost. This is the case with all designated gifts to Week of Compassion. Even a general gift only has about a 5% administrative cost. For a non-profit organization this is almost unprecedented.

Where is God in all of this? I believe God is present with all who hurt as we do what we can to touch the lives of those who cry out for help.
