Thinking Out Loud...

The sermon on Sunday, February 4 was based on Mark 1:29-39. I specifically focused on the portions of the story that indicated that in the midst of reaching out to people with all kinds of needs Jesus withdrew to pray and connect with God. This is one of the primary ways that Jesus was sustained in his life and ministry.

Lent begins on February 14, which is Ash Wednesday. One of the things that is central to our journey through Lent is a time of prayer, reflection, and looking inward as we consider our relationship with God and with each other. Lent is also a good time to refuel as we open our hearts and minds to the presence of God. As I noted in the sermon on February 4, unless we take care of ourselves, then we have nothing to offer others. That's why Parker Palmer says that self-care is never a selfish act.

Society often sends the message that unless we are always doing something and producing something, then we are of little value. That's why the message of the Christian faith is counter-cultural. We say that to pray and listen for the voice of God in our lives is as significant as anything that we do.

To connect with God helps give us the direction that we need in order have our priorities in order. This might include not producing as society says that we ought to be producing. For followers of Jesus the goal of life is not to reach the top of the ladder or to accumulate wealth. The goal is to reflect the love of God revealed in Jesus. We gain strength for this sometimes difficult goal by spending time with God. If we don't have time for this, then we need to take a serious look at ourselves.

As I noted in the sermon, the fact of that matter is that we have limits. Jesus is the example of this. He didn't heal everyone, and he didn't tend to everyone's needs. Jesus had limits, and so do we. Prayer is an acknowledgement of these limits. If Jesus didn't need God to make it through his days, then he wouldn't have needed to withdraw from the crowds in order to pray.

Lent is a season on the church calendar when we remind ourselves of our need for God because we are limited. When we gather for worship on Ash Wednesday, we will give the ultimate acknowledgment of our limits when we have ashes placed on our head and hear the words, "You are dust, and to dust you will return." But we can embrace this limit because we know what will come at the end of the journey on April 1, Easter Sunday.

World Day of Prayer services spotlight a different country


