Free Depression Screening

Clinical depression affects19 million Americans. One in four women and one in ten men will experience it. Individuals who participate in depression screenings at the CTS Counseling Center will complete a brief questionnaire that will be reviewed by a member of the CTS Counseling Center team. The individual will then have the opportunity to meet with a CTS Counseling Center team member for a one-on-one assessment of their screening results. In addition, participants will receive educational information on mental health and support resources.

Did You Know? [from the Perpetual (Endowment) Fund]

Several SCC members and friends are using the method described below to fund their tithes and offerings for the year and other gifts to the church. Those wishing to know more are strongly encouraged to check with a trusted financial advisor or accountant for important details and requirements.

From the Christian Church Foundation: "...an IRA charitable rollover allows a taxpayer (who is over the age of 70) to transfer up to \$100,000 annually to a qualified charity or charities [in this case, Speedway Christian Church] from their IRA account(s). This is known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). If a taxpayer requests a Qualified Charitable Distribution prior to taking their IRA's required minimum distribution, there is no income tax on the withdrawal from their IRA, and it will count towards the taxpayers required minimum distribution. For many taxpayers, this will reduce both federal and state taxes, and may even lower the cost of income based Medicare premiums."
